



Electronic Filing

Electronic Filing:

Electronic filing is the means by which your return is transmitted directly to the IRS and state tax authorities. The IRS has implemented an electronic filing mandate requiring certain preparers, including this firm, to file all returns that they prepare electronically. Some states also require certain preparers to electronically file state returns prepared. The IRS and some states allow taxpayers to elect not to file their returns electronically.
